Additional Covid specific mitigations for church services during Covid-19 that are not covered elsewhere in the risk assessment. Those who are reading or leading intersessions during a service will be given Their own radio microphone that will be sanitised before and after the service. This is to prevent them from shouting. During Covid-19 we are not hading out service sheet or books in line with government guideline. If people bring their own service sheets or books they are to be reminded to take them home. During Covid-19 the congregation will be asked not to shout responses in line with government guideline. During Covid-19 we will not be singing during services in line with government guideline, instead we will introduce music in other ways where possible. During Covid-19 we are still streaming our services to a public forum to allow those who are at risk to continue to meet with us in a sit free way. We are following the Government Law of the wearing of masks, everyone is to were a mask during the service or helping in some way, (e.g Preaching, leading prayers, reading the Bible) At the current time, if someone other then the Minister of the church is leading or preaching a second lecture will be provided for the person assisting the Minister of the church in the service.
