One More Step to grow in Christ



Over the past few years we have been talking about taking *One More Step...* as we grow in Christ.

Nothing in life comes easy really. We need to work hard at whatever it is that we need to do. That is the same in our spiritual life, not just our physical life.

Paul says in his letter to Timothy, "*train yourself to be godly. For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come*".

(1 Timothy 4:7-8)

If this is a command to Timothy, a minister chosen by Paul himself, how much more is it true for us. We need to train ourselves in Godliness.

To do that, we need to work hard, like Andy has said to us in his recent sermon, that as we take away our sin in our lives we need to fill it with Godly behaviour and habits.

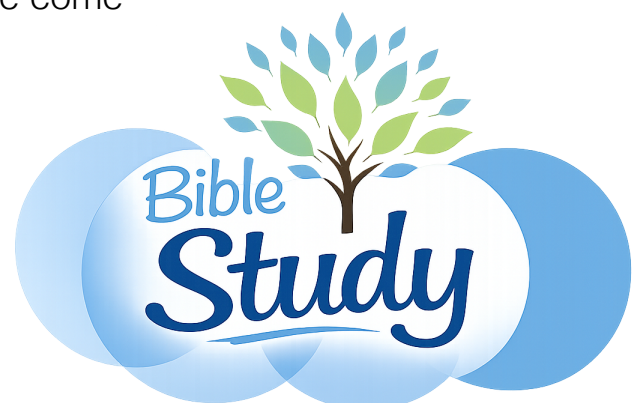
So then, I would like to encourage you to study your Bible, to work hard in looking at what God says to us through his word.

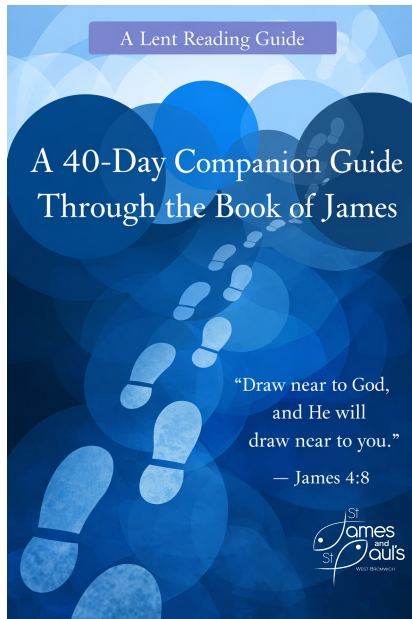
Lent readings

START LENT WITH JESUS

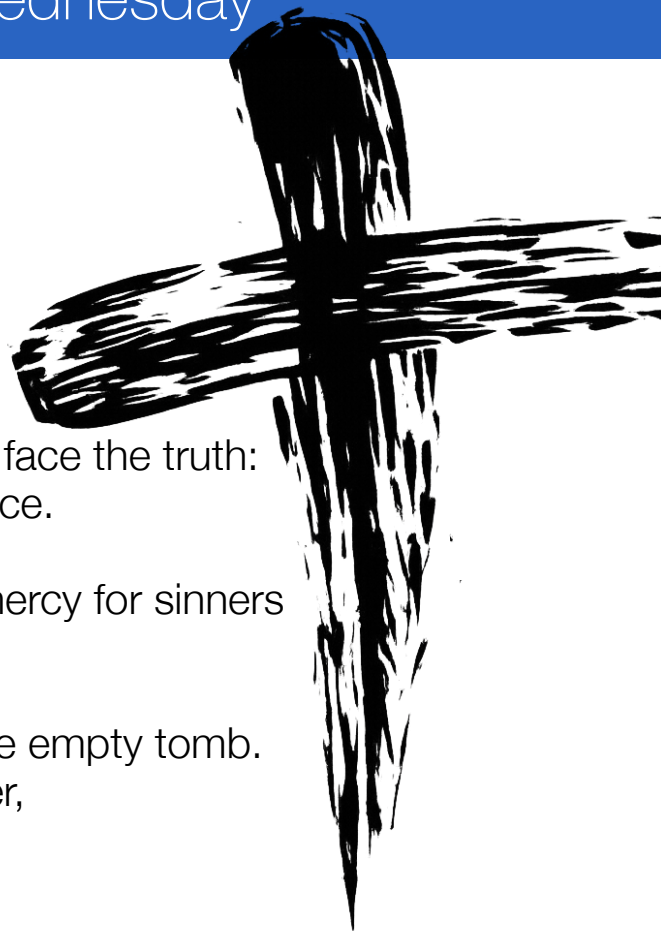
The facts are, we are not trying to be “better people”. We can only respond to a better Saviour.

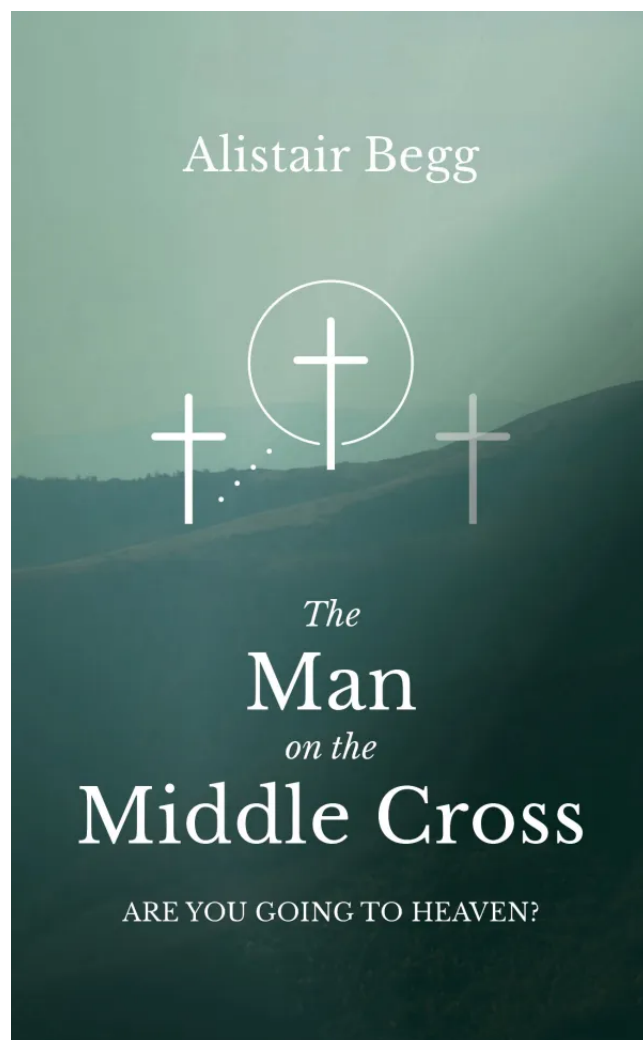
